- 1) The first question is to ask yourself if entrepreneurship or business ownership is for you and your family. It I important to make sure you have the support of your family. It can help to set expectations by establishing financial and time deadlines. - 3) If you want to launch a business you will need to learn about your market and region. You have two options:
  - A) Request "Market and Industry Analysis Resources" document from AnswerLine (contact info below)
  - B) Review article from SBA <u>www.sba.gov/starting-business/how-start-business/understand-your-market</u>
- 4) When you have decided to start your business Southwest Wisconsin SBDC Business Consultant Brock Waterman can help! Before your first phone or in-person session you need to complete and email to Brock either the one-page "Business Information" (available from the AnswerLine) or a first draft of your Business Plan.
- 5) Need help creating pro forma financials (so you can apply for financing)? Brock can help you via a template we use. The process works best if you think about what 3 costs:
  - A) Startup costs (what you need to get business open)
  - B) Fixed costs (bills you will have to pay each month)
  - C) Variable costs (costs associated with each sale, service provided, and/or product sold)
- 6) Before filing documents decide on a business name. Use your past research to inform your decision and check:
  - Wisconsin to make sure it is not used (www.wdfi.org/apps/CorpSearch/Search.aspx)
  - The trademarks and/or service marks database if you want a national brand (www.uspto.gov)
  - Website domain names (www.godaddy.com/domains/domain-name-search.aspx?countryview=1)
  - Google via several search queries to see what else is out there and how stiff the competition is
  - Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, LinkedIn, Yelp and other social media platforms for name availability
- 7) Ready to start the business? If you are forming an LLC or Corporation you will likely have to do the following 5 items:
  - A) To form a LLC or Corporation in Wisconsin do this at: www.wdfi.org/apps/CorpFormation/
- B) The online FEIN (Federal Employer Identification Number) application which issues the number immediately is done at: www.irs.gov/businesses/small/article/0,,id=102767,00.html
  - C) Business Registration (WI Tax) Department of Revenue at: <a href="www.revenue.wi.gov/faqs/pcs/btr.html">www.revenue.wi.gov/faqs/pcs/btr.html</a>
  - D) Wisconsin Seller's Permit/Sales Tax at: <a href="https://www.revenue.wi.gov/DORForms/btr-101.pdf">www.revenue.wi.gov/DORForms/btr-101.pdf</a>
  - E) Setup a bank/credit union account and credit card and keep finances separate from personal accounts
